- Trick- a cunning or skillful act or scheme intended to deceive or outwit someone; a wile; deceit; deception
 - Tricks are not new
 - > The first trick
 - People who used tricks

- Meeting of the kings
 - Plan of attack against the Israelites
 - Kings unite to fight the Israelites
 - The kings of the Hittites, the Amorites, the Canaanites, the Perizzites, Hivites, and the Jebsites
 - Old proverb: "The enemy of my enemy is my friend"

- Making of the trick
 - Two formidable enemies-Jericho and Ai
 - Formidable meaning they brought about fear and respect to them by being large, powerful and intense
 - > Jericho represents the world
 - Ai represents the flesh
 - Gibeon represents the devil
 - Gibeonites decide to use trickery against the lsraelites

Caught In A Trick

Joshua Deceived By Gibeonites

- Execution of the trick
 - First, they pretended to be from a far country
 - Second, they told Joshua they were his servants
 - Third, they said they came because they heard about their God
 - Fourth, they had moldy and dry bread, worn wineskins and clothes

- -Consequences of the trick
 - The Israelites discover the Gibeonites were their neighbors
 - The cities of Gibeon, Beeroth, Chephirah and Kirjathjearim were spared
 - The people of Israel murmured against the princes because of the vow
 - The Gibeonites were cursed by Joshua and made servants
 - The Israelites disobeyed God's instruction concerning the Canaanites
